

MEMORY CAFÉ INFORMATION SHEET

What is a Memory Café?

A Memory Café is an informal but structured group, where you will be able to meet and talk with other people affected by dementia in a social environment aimed at providing support, stimulation, education and friendship.

There will also be access to information about dementia, local services and practical tips about living well with dementia.

You will have the opportunity to suggest information you would like or the type of activities you would like to do.

What can you expect from us?

Once you have shown an interest in the café, the facilitator or volunteer will give you any other information you require.

You will be asked to give your consent to attend a Memory Café (a consent form, emergency contact details, address.) This information will be stored in a secure office.

We will take your attendance each time for fire safety and monitoring.

Providing you have given consent, we may contact you if you have not come for a while. This will be to see if we can support you to attend the group, if you'd like to.

If the time comes when the café is no longer able to meet your needs we can signpost you to alternate services that may help.

Cancellation of changes: On very rare occasions it may be necessary for us to cancel or change the time of the café. If this does happen, we will contact you as soon as possible

What a Memory Café can't provide

- Personal care a volunteer cannot assist with medication, washing, dressing or going to the toilet
- A counselling service
- A transportation service
- Services offered by social workers, solicitors, financial experts or other specialist professionals
